



MUSÉE D'ARCHÉOLOGIE



The Musée d'Archéologie is located in the former Abbaye Ste Bénigne . It includes many discoveries from Alésia, Vertault and les Bolards, three major archaeological sites in Burgundy.

Le Consortium was established in 2011 in a specifically designed 4,000 square-meter building by Japanese architect Shigeru Ban, but its history began in 1977 on the first floor of an alternative bookstore, and later in a former appliance store located at the back of a courtyard on the central market square in Dijon. Here, young academics carried out their ambition to exhibit the art of their time. Le Consortium's Collection, now permanently exhibited on the top floor of the building, includes more than 350 works. Essentially comprised of gifts from the artists who have exhibited there, it forms a true memory of these exhibitions.

MUSTARD



Dijon is known for its famous mustard. The two most famous shops are Maille and Edmond Fallot. In those shops, you will be able to taste different types of mustard.

In Dijon you can find one of the oldest French companies created 220 years ago, Mulot et Petitjean, which specializes in gingerbread making, called "pain d'épices" in French. The main ingredients are honey, eggs, flour and spices. You can also try the "nonnette", a gingerbread biscuit filled with jam.

MAISON MILLIÈRE

The Maison Millière, situated in the rue de la Chouette, next to Notre Dame church, is a restaurant as well as a tea room. They serve Burgundy traditional dishes in a beautiful house built in the 15th century.

LOISEAU DES DUCS

Loiseau des Ducs is a very fancy, Michelin-starred restaurant that serves traditional food and wine in a 15th century mansion.

LES HALLES

Les Halles are housed in a wonderful old wrought-iron building from the late 1800s. Modelled after the old Halles of Paris, this structure is the centre of a lively area of shops and restaurants. They offer meat, cheese, and other typical regional products: lots of beef for "boeuf bourguignon", chicken for "coq au vin", "jambon persillé" (ham and pork in a terrine, covered with a parsley gelatine), and of course a wide variety of cheeses.

OUTDOORS UNMISSABLE

OWL



This Owl was added to the Church of Notre-Dame around the 16th century. No one knows who carved it. It can be considered as one of the most famous gems of Dijon. Legend has it that if you rub it with your left hand and make a wish, it will come true. But in order for your wish to come true, you must not look at the black cat statue situated on the roof of the Maison Millière right next to the church.

PHILIPPE LE BON TOWER

One of the most famous things to see in Dijon is the Philippe le Bon Tower. First of all, observe the richly sculpted decoration of the staircase which served the ducal home. Afterwards, admire the superb vault of the large spiral, ornated with lighters and firestones, the symbols of Duke Philippe le Bon and the order of the Golden Fleece. Climb up its 316 steps and enjoy a unique view of the town. Tickets can be purchased at the tourist information office (11 rue des Forges).

DARCY GARDENS

The Darcy Gardens are situated next to Place Darcy. These gardens are famous for their huge fountain but also for their polar bear statue, a replica of the famous Pompon bear by the local sculptor François Pompon, here made by Henry Martinet.

OUTDOORS CHURCHES

NOTRE DAME



The Notre-Dame Basilica was built in the 13th century. You can find on one of its walls the famous owl and see the numerous fake gargoyles on the façade. Many legends are associated with that church, like that of a moneylender who was about to get married but was crushed by one of the gargoyles that fell down the façade. Following that event, most of the gargoyles were removed and replaced by fake ones. Some original gargoyles do remain on the sides.

ST BÉNIGNE

The cathedral of St Bénigne was named after the first apostle of Burgundy. It is a typical Gothic church with a Romanesque-style crypt. The cathedral's 93-meter (305foot) spire is the highest in Dijon.

Saint-Michel Church is a gothic church from the 16th century.

OUTDOORS PLACES

PLACE DE LA LIBÉRATION



Dijon's city hall is located in the Dukes' palace. In front of the palace, there is the Place de la Libération. There you will find many restaurants around the square.

At the center of the Place de la République you will find a huge fountain with a statue of Sadi Carnot, former French President who was assassinated in 1894. Tram stops can be found on each side of the square.


